Molly J. Gutilla (she/her) is an Associate Professor in the Department of Epidemiology at the Colorado School of Public Health and the Department of Health and Exercise Science at Colorado State University. With expertise in epidemiology, public health data management, and community-driven solutions, her work centers on addressing health inequities through teaching, research, and practice. Dr. Gutilla earned her Doctor of Public Health (DrPH) in Epidemiology from the University of Colorado, Colorado School of Public Health.



A dedicated educator, Dr. Gutilla teaches courses in epidemiology, research methods, data management and analysis, and leadership. She mentors graduate students, contributes to interdisciplinary

committees, and leads initiatives to enhance teaching and mentoring practices across the university. Dr. Gutilla's research explores the intersection of public health practice and policy, with an emphasis on environmental epidemiology, social determinants of health, and public health data methodologies. She has published in peer-reviewed journals, contributed to community health needs assessments, and served as a COVID-19 modeling and analytics team leader during the pandemic.

Committed to fostering collaborations between academia and practice, Dr. Gutilla has built strong partnerships with public health organizations to advance health outcomes. She currently serves as the President of the Health District of Northern Larimer County's Board of Directors and works to promote the development academic health departments across Colorado.

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
